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Biography

Barbra Mann Wall, PhD, RN, FAAN, who holds the Thomas A. Saunders III Professorship, focuses on the gendered story of hospital establishments and the nursing profession. Her award-winning book, *Unlikely Entrepreneurs: Catholic Sisters and the Hospital Marketplace, 1865-1925* (Ohio State University Press,

2005), integrates history and nursing practice to inform how America's two-tiered, public-private approach to health delivery serves a diverse American populace. Her second book, *American Catholic Hospitals: A Century of Changing Markets and Missions* (Rutgers University Press, 2011), analyzes the heretofore invisible role of Catholic sister nurses as leaders of the largest not-for-profit health care system in the US, noting tensions that developed as religious institutions attempted to directly shape health policies in a diverse milieu.

Dr. Wall's newest book, *Into Africa: A Transnational History of Catholic Missions and Social Change* (Rutgers University Press, 2015), explores the intersection of religion, medicine, gender, race, and politics in sub-Saharan Africa after World War II. She also is co-editor, with UVA Nursing's Dr. Arlene Keeling, of two books on the history of nursing in disasters: *Nurses on the Front Lines: When Disasters Strike, 1878-2010* (2010); and *Nurses and Disasters: Global, Historical Cases* (2015), and serves as editor in chief of *Health Emergency and Disaster Nursing*.

Dr. Wall earned her BS from the University of Texas at Austin, her MS in nursing from Texas Woman's University, and earned a PhD in history from the University of Notre Dame.

Dr. Wall will retire as director of the Bjoring Center for Nursing Historical Inquiry in May 2021.

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Dr. Trevor Lane, DPhil, PGCELT

Born and educated in the United Kingdom, Dr Lane has 25 years of experience helping authors communicate their research findings in English-language journals, conferences, reports, proposals, press releases and lay summaries. He has a broad background in the biomedical sciences, having graduated with an MA in Biochemistry and Chemical Pharmacology and a PhD in Physiological Sciences (cancer genetics) from the University of Oxford. After completing postdoctoral research projects in clinical oncology and genetics in Hong Kong, he served in a variety of senior editorial roles in academic, research, and publishing institutions. He was the managing editor of several general and specialist medical journals based in Asia and the senior editor of two social science journals based in the United States.

From 2005-2015, Dr Lane headed the knowledge exchange unit and taught science research communication and ethics at the Faculty of Dentistry, The University of Hong Kong. From 2015-2018, he was Education Director and Senior Publishing Consultant at Edanz Group, Japan. He is currently a publishing and education consultant based in Hong Kong and regularly delivers lectures and webinars, leads interactive workshops, and provides individual consultations in writing, presenting, reading, peer review, and publishing for researchers of all levels and disciplines.

Dr Lane is a member of the Royal Society of Biology, World Association of Medical Editors, Asia Pacific Association of Medical Journal Editors, Institute of Scientific and Technical Communicators, American Copy Editors Society, Council of Science Editors, Public Relations and Communications Association, and International Association of Teachers of English as a Foreign Language. He currently serves as an elected Council Member of the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE). He holds a Certificate in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages from Trinity College London and a Postgraduate Certificate in English Language Teaching from the University of Reading.
